Learning Support

Educational Support is provided as a multi-tiered system:



- General Support
- Moderate Support
- ➤ Intensive Support A
- ➤ Intensive Support B
- L2 Support Nachhilfe
- Challenge Programme





General Support



- ➤ **General Support** starts when the class teacher notices that a student is falling behind in some learning areas.
- ➤ The class teacher makes a request for General Support to the section Support coordinator.
- ➤ The class teacher informs the **parents** and sends a form to ask **permission for General Support**.



General Support



- Support can take place in or outside the classroom in small groups following a Group Learning Plan.
- An **update** of the progress is given through the two **school reports** (February and June).
- A child can stay on General Support for a semester or a full-school year, if their targets change during the year. (short-term)
- > Parents will be notified when General Support is no longer needed.



Moderate Support



- ➤ If the learning goals have not been fully achieved with General Support, the child may move to the **next** Support level.
- The Support teacher, class teacher and coordinator will determine the need for Moderate Support.
- An Individual Learning Plan (ILP) is created and the parents are invited to a meeting where the ILP is discussed.



The plans are signed and the parents receive a copy of the plan which is reviewed twice a year.

Moderate Support



- A child may continue with Moderate Support in the following school year or go back to General Support as needed depending on the progress made. (short-term)
- This information will be shared with parents at the end of the year **review meeting**.
- ➤ If there are **continued concerns** for a child on Moderate Support and sufficient progress is not made, a **request** may be made by the school for **additional testing** in order to best meet a child's learning needs.



Intensive A Support



- Intensive A Support is provided for pupils with diagnosed special educational needs: this could be learning, emotional, behavioural or physical needs following an expert's assessment and diagnosis.
- The assessment reports that the school receives must contain certain information to meet the requirements set by Brussels to be able to receive Intensive A Support which is our highest level of Support.
- > These assessment reports are held strictly confidential!



Ideally, each child should be assessed in their mother tongue. The **report** can be **translated** into **English**, **French**, **German**.

Intensive A Support



- When the school receives the official papers from the specialist, an Individual Learning Plan (ILP) is drawn up and a Support Advisory Board meeting is scheduled to discuss and the Support agreement. (Long-term)
- The staff, parents and director sign the papers, the parents receive a copy.
- The **set-up** meeting of Intensive A Support can take place at any time throughout the year **as** the cases are **identified.**



The Individual Learning Plan is **discussed and** reviewed twice a year in an Advisory Board meeting with the parents.



Intensive B Support



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- Intensive B Support may be provided, following a discussion with the section Support coordinator and teachers, if a child comes into a language section without the necessary level of language to access the curriculum.
- This support is ideally short-term and the **parents** should **support the language learning** heavily outside the school. (e.g. **private tutor**, **language school**, **community resources**)
- The European School system allows children **two years** to acquire the necessary language level to succeed without the need for learning Support. The school considers that children need a **B2** language level to access the curriculum in their language section.


L2 Support - Nachhilfe



- ➤ L2 Support Nachhilfe, falls under the school's General Support and is offered to pupils from Class 3-5 who need support for their 2nd Language studies.
- > Students who are already receiving Intensive B Support may also be offered L2 Support in special cases.
- ➤ L2 Support Nachhilfe classes take place on Wednesday afternoons.
- > Students are recommended for L2 Support by their L2 teacher at the class council meetings at the end of the school year, or when a need is identified by their L2 teacher.



L2 Support - Nachhilfe



- Parents receive a letter explaining the Support. A parent permission letter is signed to agree to participate in L2 Support – Nachhilfe classes.
- A group plan (similar to general Support) is written up and reviewed twice a year by the L2 Support - Nachhilfe teacher and the second language teacher.
- ▶ It may be recommended that the child continue to participate in L2 Support Nachhilfe or leave Nachhilfe at that time.
- The parents will be informed of the decision per email.





➤ The Challenge Programme offers additional resources for a small group of children from classes 3 to 5 who are exceptionally able and are excelling.

It is not restricted to gifted children but open to children who do extremely well, regardless if their results are obtained easily or through motivation and hard work.

➤ A child may participate in the Challenge Progamme following a written recommendation from the class teacher, and a discussion with the Head Support Coordinator and the Deputy Director.



Our Challenge Programme includes the following topics:











- Goals: the development of general and specific understanding of mathematical problem-solving strategies – with fun!
- From concrete to abstract we understand mathematical connections and reflect mathematical contexts.
- > How do we work ? / What do we do ?
 - Working on mathematical problem areas
 - Puzzles
 - Preparation for math competitions
 - Mathematical excursions
- ➤ Multimedia learning: use of different media such as games, writings, learning stations, learning material and our natural surroundings.

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- Specially designed Robotics program to provide more real-world and mathematical challenges in a fun-filled manner, to accelerate learning and the curiosity for high-ability kids.
- Nurturing Special Talent
 - STEM / MINT education
 - Gifted education strategies
- > How?
 - Accelerate learning to strengthen basics
 - Compact content to avoid repetition of topics
 - Group children with similar abilities
 - Challenges that cater to the skill level and interest of the children
 - Prepare the children to represent the school at the Robotic competition
