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Annotations

- a. Languages I, II and III are the languages your child is currently studying in S1. It is not possible to change them in S2. For SWALS pupils, the Language I is not the language of their section.
- b. Girls and boys are separated during Physical Education lessons.
- c. Only the Catholic and Protestant Religions are taught at school. It is possible that Religion courses are not taught in French: this depends on the number of applications.
- d. If your child is enrolled in Bläserklasse, he or she must continue this course in S2.
- e. The choice of the Latin course is compulsory for S2 and S3. It is not possible to stop Latin between the two years, under any circumstances and on any date. The choice of Latin is not compatible with the optional ICT course in S3.
- f. The Ancient Greek course is taught in Modern Greek and is therefore exclusively reserved for pupils attending the Language I Greek course.
- g. Music, Art and Physical Education lessons are given to mixed groups of pupils from all three language sections. The teachers will use at least two of the working languages to teach the pupils.
- h. If a course is created with less than seven pupils, the number of periods allocated to the course will be reduced according to official rules.
