## Annotations

- a. Languages I, II and III are those studied since S1; it is not possible to change them.
- b. The choice of a subject commits a pupil for two years (for S4 and S5): (s)he cannot change, drop or add any subject as from the start of the 4<sup>th</sup> year. Requests for changes will not be accepted after submission of this form.
- c. The choices for years S4 and S5 should be made very carefully. All the subjects (with the exception of Religion/Ethics) are promotion subjects! Consider the number of working hours if you choose 8 hours options!
- d. Pupils who choose 4-Period Mathematics must choose between 4 and 8 periods of options.
- e. Pupils who choose 6-Period Mathematics must choose between 4 and 6 periods of options.
- f. An optional course can only be organised if it is chosen by a sufficient number of candidates (a minimum of 7 pupils).
- g. Optional subjects which have not been chosen in S4 and S5 (Economics, Language IV, ...) cannot be started in S6, unless the pupil takes a test at the end of the first semester of S5 which proves that he or she has acquired the necessary skills to follow these subjects successfully up to the baccalaureate.
- h. As some of the options have to be timetabled concurrently, it will not be possible to provide all combinations, e.g. timetabling constraints make it impossible for a pupil to choose for example both Latin and Economics.
- i. The History, Geography and Religion / Ethics courses are taught in Language II (English, French, German).
- j. Economics is only proposed in Language II German or Language II English. For pupils with Language II French, they may choose one of the existing groups in German or English.
- k. The Art, Music, ICT and Physical Education courses are taught to mixed language groups in at least one of the three working languages (English, French, German). For some pupils this may therefore be in their mother tongue, for others in one of the working languages, but not necessarily in the pupil's Language II.
