

Pedagogical organisation NURSERY & PRIMARY

Principle:

Lessons for Primary classes are provided “in situ” at school. Children can mix in their own year group only.

Ex: class 1 children can only mix with other class 1 children.

ORGANISATION PRIMARY (P1-P5)

1/ Organisation of the week (principles):

- The timetable for Primary will continue as it has been since September 1st.
- Transport will be running as normal. The same rules apply as for public transportation, masks are mandatory.
- Pupils in Primary will go directly to their classrooms. Teachers will be required to be present in their classroom(s) at 7.45.
- All children of Primary/Nursery will enter through the left part of the blue gate. All pupils are requested to wear their mask when entering and leaving the school buildings on arrival and departure. OS children will enter on the right part.
- Class 1 pupils will be escorted to the blue gate at 15.30 on long days and 12.10 on short days. Other year groups will finish school at the normal times.
- Parents are instructed to respect social distance (1,5 m) and to wear a mask when bringing/collecting their child in front of the blue gate.
- The canteen is open, a plan was made to avoid cross year mixing of groups of children (see document “safety and security measures for pupils and staff”).

2/ Organisation of lessons and breaks:

Teaching will be organised in a regular way

- From the 17th of November 2021 **wearing of masks in the classroom is compulsory for pupils and teachers in primary** (Alarmstufe). They must also continue to wear the mask outside of their classroom and while going to other areas of the school.
- **Masks are not compulsory** for pupils when they are taking part in sports activities, playing outside and eating.
- L2 lessons will run as normal as the children mix within their own year group.
- Cross year groupings of lessons is reduced. Are there positive Covid cases, cross year groupings are stopped.
- Choir will stop due to the Alarmstufe.
- Breaktime is organised normally, 9h40-10h05 and 13h45-14h05. Each year group of children will be allocated a large designated area for their year group.
- In order to properly **ventilate** the classroom, teachers will open the windows and door at the start, middle and end of every lesson, for a 3-minute period. Children should wear multiple layers. It may be beneficial for children to wear a thermal underlayer in the winter months. If each child had a fleece jacket/top on the back of their chair, they could easily put it on for the ventilation periods. Teachers could use this short break as an opportunity to incorporate movement into their lesson.

3/ Health and safety measures are communicated in a separate document to parents and staff.

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ORGANISATION NURSERY (M1-M2)

1/ Organisation of the week in KG (principles):

- The timetable for Nursery will continue as it has been since September 1st.
- Parents are instructed to respect social distance (1,5 m) when bringing/collecting their child and to wear a mask.
- Due to the renovation work for this school year, KG children of the small DE group use the blue gate to enter and exit the school.
- The staff will continue to explain and model safety and other hygienic measures such as hand washing and using hand sanitiser etc.
- The canteen is open; the KG children can receive their food from the canteen in their classroom as normal at 11.30.

2/ Organisation of lessons and breaks:

- During lessons masks are not mandatory for children but they may wear them voluntarily if they wish
- In order to properly **ventilate** the classroom, teachers will open the windows and door at the start, middle and end of every lesson, for a 3-minute period. Children should wear multiple layers. It may be beneficial for children to wear a thermal underlayer in the winter months. If each child had a fleece jacket/top on the back of their chair, they could easily put it on for the ventilation periods. Teachers could use this short break as an opportunity to incorporate movement into their lesson.
